Why are we drifting apart? What are the implications for engaging men in caregiving? Might care be a solution?

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

The media, peers and workplaces often continue to sell the "old" version of success






The heart of the gender pay gap: who does the care work

1.08 TIMES physical care for elders












SONS TAKING AFTER FATHERS IN DOMESTIC WORK

So, where are the men when it comes to care policies?








HOW TO BRING MEN INTO THE CARE AGENDA?
